What is the Community Paper Quilt Project?

The Community Paper Quilt Project is a project that celebrates the rich heritage and unique story of the Cromwell community. Each participant will submit a paper “quilt square” that they have decorated. Completed squares will then be joined to create three unique paper quilts to display in our community.

Who may participate?

The project is open to any individual who lives, works, or goes to school in Cromwell.

How do I participate?

In the fall of 2015 blank squares of two sizes – 4”x4” or 8”x8” – will be available for pick up at the Cromwell Public Library, Covenant Village Commons Reception Desk, or the Cromwell Board of Education office. Each individual is asked to complete a square and return it finished to the Cromwell Public Library within two weeks.

Workshops will also be held for interested participants who would like to complete a square. Dates, locations will be announced soon!

Students will be completing their squares during their art class in the schools.

You do not have to attend a workshop to participate!

MEDIA/MATERIALS to use in art making:

Paints

Pens

Colored Pencil

Markers

Crayons

Collage

Mixed Media

*** Art work may protrude forward from the mat board piece, but not extend beyond the perimeter of the piece due to the paper quilting process of assembly.

NOTE: non-acceptable materials: No pastels, No chalk, No charcoal, No glitter.

Completed quilt squares may be dropped off at the Cromwell Library.
